EU Statement on the Attack at Moscow Airport

Mr. Chairperson,

The European Union would like to draw the attention to the Statements made by EU High Representative, Catherine Ashton and President of the European Council, Herman Van Rompuy on the attack at the Moscow's Domodedovo airport (SEC.DEL/26/11, SEC.DEL/27/11).

The EU strongly condemns the murderous attack at Moscow's Domodedovo airport that claimed the lives of at least 35 people and wounded more than 130.

The EU expresses its deepest condolences to the families and friends of the victims and to the Russian government. Innocent travellers have been killed by this brutal, random attack.

The EU condemns all acts of terrorism, and expresses its solidarity with the Russian people.
