The Permanent Council,

Recalling Decision No. 1111 of 19 December 2013 on the dates and venue of the 2014 OSCE-Japan Conference, to be held in Tokyo, Japan, on 16 and 17 June 2014,

Further to the discussion within the framework of the Contact Group with the Asian Partners for Co-operation,

Welcoming the offer by Japan to host the annual conference with the Asian Partners for Co-operation,

Decides to hold the 2014 OSCE-Japan Conference on sharing experiences and lessons learned between the OSCE and Asian Partners for Co-operation in order to create a safer, more interconnected and fairer world in the face of emerging challenges;

Representatives of non-governmental organizations will be able to attend and contribute to the Conference in accordance with the relevant OSCE provisions and practices (advance registration required).

III. Timetable and other organizational modalities

The Conference will begin at 9.15 a.m. (opening session) on 16 June 2014 and end at 1:30 p.m. on 17 June 2014.

The opening and closing sessions will be chaired by a representative of the OSCE Chairperson-in-Office and a representative of the host country.

Each session will have a moderator and a rapporteur. The consolidated summary will be forwarded to the Permanent Council.

Rules of procedure and working methods of the OSCE will be applied, *mutatis mutandis*, to the Conference.

The opening and closing sessions will be open to the media. The Conference will be held in Tokyo, Japan. The working language will be English.
