The mission of Centres of Excellence

A coordinated strategy for CBRN risk mitigation

Effective response to **CBRN** risk depends on cooperation and co-ordination between all levels of government, response organizations and international partners.
An effective strategy to deal with CBRN threats requires a very high level of cooperation and co-ordination among countries. Lack of harmonized national preparedness and fragmentation of responsibilities within regional or international anti-trafficking system may be easily exploited by non-state actors to traffic materials and develop CBRN weapons.
