They will provide negative and positive examples of co-operation and real time information and intelligence-sharing and propose tools of effective networking of governmental organizational structures on countering drug trafficking in home countries and across the borders. 09:00-10:30	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>SESSION 2</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>TARGETING PRECURSOR CHEMICALS USED IN ILLICIT PRODUCTION OF HEROIN</b></p> <p>In order to prevent the diversion of precursor chemicals frequently used in illicit production of heroin from legitimate trade the participants will analyse obstacles to effective monitoring the manufacture, shipment, marketing and distribution of such precursors.
