**STATEMENT BY
THE DELEGATION OF UKRAINE**

I would like to register Ukraine's resolute protest regarding the use of wholly inappropriate language by the representative of the Russian Federation.

The use of Nazi and neo-Nazi rhetoric by the Russian representative constitutes an example of offensive and undiplomatic behaviour. We believe – and I am confident that all other delegations would agree – that there is no place for such weaponization of history in diplomatic fora.

The Russian side must learn to conduct itself in a manner consistent with diplomatic standards. This is not a matter for discussion but a basic requirement that should be self-evident to all – except, it appears, to one delegation.

Regarding the recent accusations made by the representative of the Russian Federation concerning the so-called “Bucha falsifications,” I would like to stress that this baseless conspiracy theory is thoroughly contradicted by satellite imagery taken during the period of Russian control over the city, as well as by forensic evidence, victim identification, and independent investigations conducted by neutral international bodies, including the UN Human Rights Office, Human Rights Watch, and the International Criminal Court.

The evidence clearly indicates that Russian forces committed war crimes in Bucha. Bucha will not be forgotten, and justice will not be delayed.

Mr. Chairperson, I kindly request that our reply be duly reflected in the journal of this meeting.
